The Keychain on your Apple devices is an encrypted database that is used to securely store website passwords, network share credentials, pass-phrases for wireless networks, encrypted disk images and even miscellaneous personal notes. It provides “behind-the scenes” functionality yet can easily be directly utilized via Apple’s *Keychain Access* application that is part of the macOS system software.
